Tetra Tech DPK (Tt DPK) is based in San Francisco and provides technical, management, and advisory services to help developing and transitioning societies navigate the challenges of modernization and democratization. We work around the world to establish and strengthen productive relationships between state and society, and develop sustainable government and justice systems that are responsive, transparent, accountable, fair, and efficient.



PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Tt DPK's Global Law and Development Fellowship provides a short-term concentrated experience for students enrolled in or having completed graduate programs in law, international development, court administration, public policy, or related areas. The program introduces fellows to judicial reform and capacity building, and provides exposure to the management and implementation of international development projects on access to justice, anti-corruption, or various aspects of the rule of law.

Since its inauguration in 2010, the program has provided a rewarding opportunity and valuable experience to nearly a dozen talented fellows of varying backgrounds. To date, these fellows have served in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Georgia, Haiti, Jordan, Liberia, and Tt DPK's San Francisco headquarters. Fellows' assignments vary depending on their language skills and interests, and on the needs of the project or office where they are assigned. Fellows generally serve from 8-12 weeks, and fellowships are awarded year-round.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Although specific responsibilities may vary from year to year, generally fellows aid in the following tasks:

- Completing a specific technical work product
- Collecting and analyzing project reports
- Identifying and capturing best practices
- Proofreading and editing reports and documents
- Organizing training courses and events
- Assisting with international consultant briefings
- Providing administrative support for programmatic activities
- Keeping notes of trainings and meetings
- Preparing a final report on experiences and lessons learned
